

## PERENNIAL CROPS

Perennial crops have a minimum age and / or production requirement as shown below.

<b><i>Minimum Insurance Requirements For Perennial Crops</i></b>		
<b><i>Crop</i></b>	<b><i>Age</i></b>	<b><i>Production</i></b>
Almonds	7 <sup>th</sup> growing season 6 <sup>th</sup> , 5 <sup>th</sup> or 4 <sup>th</sup> by approval	No requirement
Apples	None	10 bins per acre or 250 field boxes
Cherries	None	2,300 pounds per acre in one of the last 3 years
Citrus	6 <sup>th</sup> growing season	None
Figs	7 <sup>th</sup> growing season	None
Grapes	4 <sup>th</sup> year growing season 3 <sup>rd</sup> year after grafting	2 tons per acre *can be waived with NAU approval
Pears	None	5 tons per acre of first grade canning or U.S. No. 1 pears within 1 of 4 preceding crop years
Plums	5 <sup>th</sup> growing season	200 lugs of fresh market production per acre in one of the preceding crop years
Prunes	7 <sup>th</sup> growing season	None
Stonefruit	5 <sup>th</sup> growing season	200 lugs of fresh market production or 2.2 tons per acre for processing types
Table Grapes	4 <sup>th</sup> year growing season 3 <sup>rd</sup> year after grafting	150 lugs per acre
Walnuts	9 <sup>th</sup> growing season	5 acres of walnut trees minimum
